



4 THINGS TO CONSIDER WHEN CHOOSING A VET

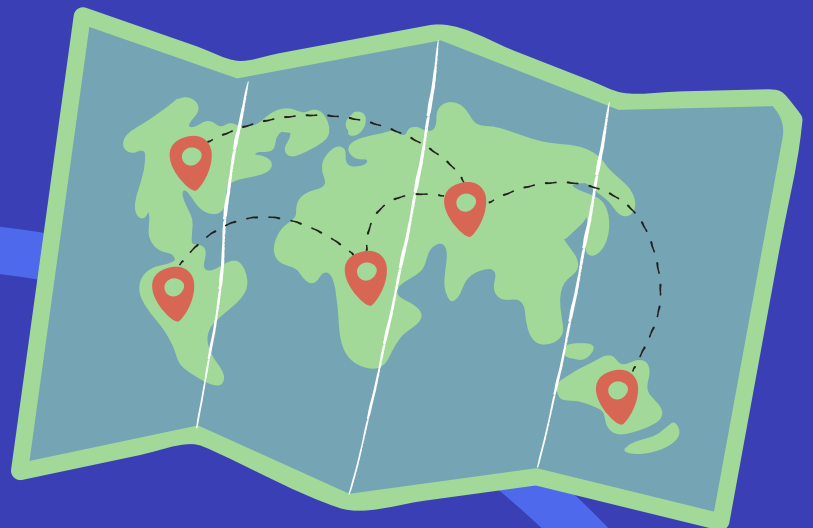


ACCESSIBILITY

If your pet has an emergency, you may need to get to the vet quickly. Choose one that's a **reasonable distance from home**.

Also check if your vet has:

- **Easy access**
- **Accommodations**
- **Flexible hours**



RELATIONSHIP

Your vet should make you feel welcomed and comfortable. They should listen to your concerns and answer all of your questions.

You can test your comfort level with a phone call. The way the receptionist talks to you can be a great example of the relationship a clinic offers.



AMENITIES

Think about the **services** that are important to you.

Examples of amenities:

- 24-hour care
- House calls
- Alternative medicine
- Specialty services
- Separate cat and dog facilities



REPUTATION

Ask friends and neighbours. Ask a shelter or veterinary specialist. This will give you an idea about who the professionals respect.

Take online reviews with a grain of salt. People often write negative reviews when they receive bad news.
